#### God Story:

Cornelius | Acts 10

## **Big Idea:**

Following Jesus starts with hearing the good news.

## **Key Verse:**

Say with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord." Believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead. Then you will be saved. | Romans 10:9 (NIRV)

# Leader Tips:

- Pray for the kids in your group before they arrive. Pray that Jesus would be real to them and meet them wherever they're at.
- Make sure everyone knows the good news: Jesus came to show us God's love, save us from sin, and share his peace.
- Look for ways to provide practical examples of what it means to follow Jesus.

#### 2 minutes

Find out what the kids think would be the best possible news someone could burst in and share with them. Introduce today's Big Idea.

#### 2. Intro Activity

5 minutes

Act out scenarios with someone announcing great news.

# **1. CONVERSATION STARTER**

# Supplies:

# None

# Leader Tip:

• The Conversation Starter is a great way to make everyone feel welcome and build community! Use it to set the tone for your group's time together.

# Instructions:

- a. As the kids arrive, welcome them and gather everyone together.
- b. Encourage them to imagine someone bursting in and announcing, "I have good news!"
- c. Ask: What's the best news that person could share? (e.g., something fun like "I have chocolate for everyone!" or something more serious, such as "A family member who was sick is healed!")
- d. Depending on the size of your group, have the kids share their answers with the people sitting closest to them or with everyone.
- e. Let everyone know that the best news of all is the good news about Jesus! He loves us, he saves us from our sins, and he shares his peace.
- f. Introduce the Big Idea: Following Jesus starts with hearing the good news.

# 2. INTRO ACTIVITY

# Supplies:

• Scenario cards

# Leader Tip:

• Three to five people is the ideal number in a group for this activity. There are six scenarios, so adjust your group sizes as needed.

# Instructions:

- a. Divide the kids into groups.
- b. Give each group a scenario card.
- c. Prompt them to work together to brainstorm what great news might be in their scenario.
- d. Direct each group to choose a Good News Person. Everyone else will act in the scenario. The Good News Person will then enter and announce the news, while the other kids react with excitement.
- e. Allow the groups a couple of minutes to practise. Provide direction as needed.
- f. Invite them to act out their scenarios and share their good news with everyone.



# **3. WEEKLY VIDEO**

# Supplies:

Video file

#### Leader Tip:

• Sit with the kids and encourage them to focus on the video as necessary.

#### Instructions:

- a. Play the video. It contains:
  - Host segment
  - God Story (Cornelius | Acts 10)
  - Life Story

# 4. SMALL GROUP ACTIVITY

## Supplies:

Markers

pages

craft paper

Poster activity

# Leader Tips:

- Whiteboard or • The brainstorming in this activity will help remind the kids what the good news is and summarize it for them in manageable chunks.
  - Make sure everyone's names are on their posters.

# Instructions:

- a. Gather your small group to sit together.
- b. Discuss:
  - What was the Life Story about in today's video?
  - What was the God Story about?
- c. Place the whiteboard or craft paper where everyone can see it.
- d. Lead the group to brainstorm descriptions of the good news about Jesus and how they could share it in just one sentence (e.g., Jesus came to save us; God loved us and sent Jesus; Jesus loves everyone everywhere; etc.).

- e. Record their ideas on the board or paper.
- f. Give each person an activity page.
- g. Place the markers where everyone can reach them.
- h. Direct the kids to choose one of the brainstorming ideas, then use it in a poster announcing the good news. Their posters can include words and pictures. Encourage them to be creative!

# 5. KEY VERSE ACTIVITY

# Supplies:

- Hang the Key Verse sign where everyone can see it.
- Instructions: Smile cutout on
- craft stick
- Heart cutout on
- craft stick
- b Give both craft sticks to one of the kids. c. Lead the group to read the Key Verse together.

a. Gather everyone back together in a circle.

- d. Direct the person with the craft sticks to hold up the smile during the first sentence and the heart for the second sentence.
- e. Pass the props on to the next person and repeat reading the verse and holding up the cutouts. Make sure everyone gets at least one turn.
- f. Ask if anyone would like to say the verse on their own.
